Date: The prophecy of Joel is placed as early as the 9th century and as late as the 5th century

Highlights:

There are no dates given, and no time frame offered, in the book of Joel. It would seem more likely that Joel was prophesying through the Babylonian Invasions under King Nebuchadnezzar in 597-586 BC. Joel (along with the other prophets) tells Judah that judgment is coming. Judah needs to repent and God may still protect them. Even if they are exiled they need to repent in the hope of future restoration.

One of the most debated issues in Joel is whether we should read "Locusts" as a literal plague of insects or as a symbolic siege of a foreign army (or armies). It could be that there will be an invasion of actual locusts followed by an invasion of Babylon. Or it could be that there will be an invasion of Babylon that will be just like an invasion of locusts. Either way, it's gonna get ugly; but then...

JUDGMENT – <u>Original Meaning</u>: Judahites should fear and repent because of impending invasion. <u>NT Elaboration</u>: God's judgment comes in Christ now and will come at his return. <u>Contemporary Application</u>: Fear and repent because of God's judgment.

RESTORATION – <u>Original Meaning</u>: Judahites should repent in the hopes of experiencing restoration in the future. <u>NT Elaboration</u>: Restoration is promised to those who trust Christ now and at his return. <u>Contemporary Application</u>: Rejoice in God's salvation in Christ.
