Our History

After the continued drift away from Biblical Christianity in the mainline Presbyterian Church, a number of people discerned God's call to start a new church in Butler that would be committed to the Bible as the inerrant Word of God. In July of 1975 after much prayer, a vision of what was to become Westminster Presbyterian Church in America was born. Open church services were started at the Salvation Army Citadel Chapel on Sunday evenings. Services were later held in the gym of the Salvation Army, then the local YWCA, and finally moved into our current building in downtown Butler in February of 1976. Westminster had 159 charter members and of those, 13 are still members today. We are blessed to have several grandchildren of charter members serving in leadership roles and a few great-grandchildren participating in both our children and youth programs.



Morship



The Worship Committee is passionate about leading the congregation in worshiping our God. The committee discerns and approves all aspects of Sunday morning worship activities from pre-service preparation to the postlude following the service. Over the years, the committee has successfully created a blended service combining traditional, organ-led hymns with contemporary, praise team-led music. The committee also ensures that the sermon series, prayer times, and unison readings honor and are focused on our vertical worship of God. Lastly, the committee listens to congregational needs/concerns and responds appropriately to address issues and requests.



Discipleship

Children's Ministry



Our children's ministry focuses on helping our children and their families with building strong relationships with Christ and one another through service, a good biblical foundation, and engaging activities. Our children's ministry ages range from newborn through 5th grade. A nursery provides care for our youngest attendees while a children's worship program is provided for children ages 2 through 3rd grade during our Sunday morning worship service. In addition, Sunday School classes provide Christian education for children ages 2 through 5th grade. Additional activities are provided throughout the year to help develop deeper family and church relationships.









Youth Ministry

Westminster's Youth Ministry has always played a vital role in the church's life and ministry. Youth meet together as an entire group on Sunday evenings (Youth Group). In addition, a Girls' Small Group and a Boys' Small Group provide bi-weekly opportunities for teens to open up and discuss their daily walk. The youth ministry has always provided adult members with the opportunity to use their gifts in ministering to the youth. Youth from outside of our church are encouraged by their participation in the large and small group activities, too.









College & Career



Westminster helps young adults with building friendships and developing into disciples through Bible studies, fellowship groups, and conferences. Fellowship groups provide opportunities for young adults to meet, socialize, and build relationships, while Bible studies, typically held in the comfort of the ministry leader's home, promote spiritual growth and discipleship. Westminster's young adults also benefit from attending an annual conference together – The Jubilee Conference (hosted by Coalition for Christian Outreach).











Adult Ministry

Our overall goal of Adult Christian Education is to glorify God and equip His people, so that they will have a kingdom impact in their homes, workplaces, Butler County, and beyond. Classes include verse-by-verse studies of books of the Bible, video studies, and topical studies.

Men's Ministry

Our men's ministry helps men with developing their vertical relationship with God and their horizontal relationships with family and peers. We've found that we are most effective at helping men with learning how to integrate their faith into their everyday lives when we work through a project or competitive/adventurous experience together. We reach people through holding big events, encouraging smaller fellowship group activities, and supporting a team in a competitive softball league with other area churches.





Women's Ministry

Just as Proverbs 31 tells us that the ideal woman is virtuous, strong, and selfless, our women's ministry displays those qualities while serving our church. Our women provide meals for those having surgery and new mothers. Our women organize nursery supervision rotation, maintain our church kitchen, manage a community food cupboard, run our Sunday morning cafe, and visit shut-ins. Our ladies also oversee two women's Bible studies, provide a month's-worth of desserts for the community Meals on Wheels outreach, and prepare and serve post-funeral meals. Our women's ministry provides social opportunities including game nights, crafting, and outings involving lots of laughing and eating. We hold an annual holiday tea/party/luncheon and spring event around Mother's Day that traditionally provides us with woman-to-woman building of intergenerational relationships. If that isn't enough, our women pray... and encourage others to share and be in prayer for our families.

Senior Ministry

Our senior ministry brings together people ages 55 years-young and greater for fellowship, support, fun and (of course) food. The group has been active with multiple outdoor activities such as attending the Tall Ships Festival in Cleveland, enjoying a dinner cruise on Lake Arthur in Moraine State Park, and miniature golfing. The group also attends local music concerts, community history presentations, and other events. Our congregation is thankful and respectful to this group and its efforts in founding our church and providing our congregation with the spiritual disciplines which have empowered our ministry to remain strong throughout the years.




Church Library



The Westminster Library includes an extensive, theologically rich, selection of books for youth and adults, along with a wide variety for children. Along with books, we offer magazines, audiobooks, and DVDs. The library is constantly assessed and resources are purchased to meet the needs of the church at large and support sermon topics, Sunday School offerings, and other study needs of the congregation.

Missions

The goal of the Missions Committee at Westminster Presbyterian Church is to serve our missionary partners in any way possible. We maintain communication with both our overseas and domestic missionaries and meet with them when they are in the area. We review the budget for missions and approve new missionary candidates. The Committee arranges for missionaries to speak at our church when they are visiting and prays for their needs during regular prayer times. We strive to keep the work of our missionary families constantly before the congregation, especially those who are working in closed countries or among the unreached peoples.



Partnerships & Oureach



Westminster also desires to faithfully support several Local and Regional ministry partners. These include ministries that work with college students, summer camps that minister to children and youth, organizations that reach the local community by providing food, clothing and employment services, and various mission outreaches that focus on growing disciples of Christ.

The Church food cupboard relies on contributions from our congregation, and is managed by a church member. Each month, roughly 12-15 clients are blessed through this outreach.











For the past five years, Westminster Church has been reaching out to the community, particularly to elementary students and their families attending a local Butler City school, through Good News Club, a ministry of Child Evangelism Fellowship. There are over 20 people from the church serving in this ministry. Presently there are consistently 30 – 40 students attending this after–school Club on a weekly basis for a 6–8 week program both in the fall and in the spring. The team is excited for the opportunity to plant seeds of faith while trusting that the Lord will call many children and families to know Jesus Christ so that their lives will be transformed by the Gospel.

JIM MCCASLIN



Current Church Demographics



SANCTUARY

Our spacious sanctuary, featuring high ceilings and plentiful lighting, can seat up to 500 people.

PERRIN HALL

Our fellowship hall is the hub for helping to build community within our church body. It includes a Cafe area which offers coffee and hot drinks along with and even some occasional celebratory cake or doughnuts. This space hosts

space for visiting and even some occasional celebratory cake or doughnuts! This space hosts our gatherings for fellowship meals, meetings and small groups. As a community outreach, it is opened up twice weekly for use by the YMCA for seniors' exercise class and has also long served as a hospitality space for our city's annual Christmas parade.

KITCHEN

Updated in 2013, our roomy kitchen now offers a spacious island, multiple ovens, 5-burner gas range, commercial dishwasher and plentiful storage space. This update has greatly improved our congregation's ability to bring people together for dinners, wedding receptions, and funeral dinners.

CHURCH OFFICE

Our church office features a lobby, front office, spacious Pastor's study lined with bookcases, and a copier/supply room. A second smaller office space is used for document storage.

CLASSROOMS

While the main floor sees the most activity, the second floor is busiest on Sunday mornings with our children's Sunday school classes, adult classes, children's worship (held during morning worship), and childcare.

LIBRARY

Our spacious Library consists of two rooms, an Adult Library and a Children's Library.

NURSERY

Our Nursery is a welcoming space for children under two years of age. The room is equipped with closed circuit TV allowing the adults in the room to watch and listen to the worship service.

LOWER LEVEL

The lower level is home to our youth. This large area has an amphitheater, pool table, foosball table, 4-Square area, and meeting space along with two classrooms for smaller group breakouts and Sunday school class sessions.

ADDITIONAL PROPERTY – RENTAL UNITS & PARKING LOT

Years ago, our church purchased an older 3-story house next door that provides a source of rental income from residential and commercial tenants. "The Annex" is managed and maintained by our Board of Deacons. In addition to this rental property, Westminster purchased an adjacent piece of property for use as a church parking lot. This additional lot provides ample church parking as well as space for youth group games and other ministry outreaches to the community.



Living Area Description

Located 45 minutes north of Pittsburgh, Butler, Pennsylvania is a small city which is home to many churches of different denominations. It serves as the county seat and was formed in the early 1800s in a beautiful area surrounded by rolling hills and plenty of farmland. With a city population of 13,000 and a county population of 188,000, Butler maintains its small-town feel while still being close to a large city (Pittsburgh). Butler takes great pride in being the birthplace of the Bantam Jeep which played a large role in World War II. Over the past several years, Butler's downtown area has seen a rejuvenation including restaurants, coffee shops, and retail stores.

Butler County has several public school districts ranging in student populations between 1,200 and 7,000. There are also some excellent private Christian schools and a strong homeschooling network in the area.

There are many private Christian college and university options within an hour of Butler. Butler County Community College (BC3) offers career, transfer, and certificate programs and has been named the best community college in Pennsylvania for three consecutive years by School.com.

While downtown Butler is home to a couple of small parks, it is less than 30 minutes from Moraine and McConnel's Mill State Park and less than two hours from Presque Isle State Park on the shores of Lake Erie. These beautiful state parks offer plenty of space to hike, rock climb, boat, paddle board, swim, picnic and just enjoy being outside.

Butler has events throughout the year, including the Butler Farm Show, the Big Butler Fair, the Bantam Jeep Festival, and Cruise-A-Palooza (a giant car show). Main Street is home to several parades throughout the year, including Memorial Day, Veteran's Day and Spirit of Christmas.

Butler is not only rich in tourism but is also a beautiful place to simply enjoy the scenery and charm of this special, historic area. Generations of families have delighted to call Butler their home and it's easy to see why.
